- 8.1.1422 Žižka’s victory near Německý Brod
- 11.1.1877 † Janko Vlastimil **Matúška**, poet, hymnal author, author of the text of the Slovak National Anthem “Nad Tatrou sa blýska”
- 12.1.2012 † Milan **Salajka**, theologian, professor and dean of the Huss Czechoslovak Faculty of Theology
- 13.1.1572 † Jan **Augusta**, Unity of Brethren bishop, hymnal composer
- 19.1.1867 * Ferdinand **Hrejsa**, Protestant theologian and historian
- 24.1.1852 † Ján **Kollár**, Protestant preacher, poet and historian
- 27.1.1997 † Božena **Komárková**, philosopher and theologian, Charter 77 signatory

- 7.2.1862 † František **Škroup**, the author of the song “Kde domov můj”, its first strophe is the Czech National Anthem
- 8.2.1622 † Matouš **Konečný**, Unity of Brethren senior and bishop
- 9.2.1942 † Dr Gustav Adolf **Procházka**, patriarch of CHC in 1928–1942 (born 11. 3. 1872)

- 11.2.1547 † Jan **Roh** of Domažlice, Unity of Brethren bishop, Lutheran theologian
- 16.2.1497 * Philip **Melanchton**, Lutheran bishop, Luther's continuator, the "Teacher of Germany", author of the Augsburg Confession (1530)
- 21.2.1522 Dr Martin Luther finished the translation of the New Testament into German
- 27.2.1812 * Samo **Chalupka**, Slovak Protestant parson and poet

- 1.3.1457 Unity of Brethren founded in Kunvald (Memorial Day)
- 2.3.1282 † **St Agnes of Bohemia**, abbess, founder of Christian social institutions
- 4.3.1962 † Jan Vladimír **Šebesta**, protestant parson, founder of the Hieronymus Unity
- 5.3.1882 * Dr Antonín **Boháč**, statistician, Synodal Curator of the ECCB
- 9.3.1422 † Jan **Želivský**, radical theologian of Prague, executed
- 13.3.1977 † Jan **Patočka**, Czech philosopher, signatory and spokesman of the Charter 77
- 15.3.1932 * Dr Radoslav **Hobza**, CHC parson and historian
- 28.3.1592 * John Amos **Comenius**, Unity of Brethren bishop, educationalist, the "Teacher of Nations"
- 29.3.1372 Emmaus Monastery in Prague consecrated
- 31.3.1462 pope Pius II unilaterally cancelled the Compacts of Basle

- 3.4.1922 * Jan Milíč **Lochman**, theologian, the rector of the University of Basle
- 12.4.1437 the Compacts of Basle ceremonially proclaimed in Prague
- 20.4.1872 † Andrej Braxatoris **Sládkovič**, Protestant parson, poet and literary critic
- 21.4.1782 † Jan Theofil **Elsner**, reformed preacher in Berlin, titular Brethren senior, author of Elsner's Hymn-book
- 23.4. 997 † **St Adalbert of Prague**, second Bishop of Prague, the "First Czech European"
- 24.4.1822 Janko **Král'**, Slovak poet and revivalist

- 27.4.1452 George of Poděbrady elected as the Bohemia Land Governor
- 28.4.1962 † Dr František **Hník**, CHC bishop, professor and dean of the Huss Czechoslovak Faculty of Theology
- 29.4.1622 J. Lohelius, the Archbishop of Prague, banned the communion in both kinds

- 2.5.1922 * Luděk **Brož**, protestant theologian, journalist, professor and dean of the Comenius Protestant Faculty of Theology

- 29.5.1637 † George **Tranoscius**, protestant parson, the author of Cithara Sanctorum (born 27. 3. 1592)
- 30.5.1252 † **St Zdislava** of Lemberk, healer, patron of Northern Bohemia and family life

June

- 1.6.1822 * Ján Francisci **Rimavský**, advocate, statesman, organizer of the voluntaries in 1848–1849, the chairman of the Matica slovenská
- 10.6.1942 the village of Lidice completely demolished by Nazis
- 12.6.1927 † Dr Karel **Farský**, modernist priest, CHC founder and first patriarch

- 14.6.1932 † Dr Ferdinand **Císař**, member of the first ECCB's Synodal Council
- 16.6.1722 Herrnhut founded in Saxony
- 17.6.1412 Master John Huss refused indulgences and called the pope as Antichrist
- 21.6.1621 27 Representatives of the Czech Estates Revolt's execution at the Old Town Square in Prague, including Jan **Jessenius**, physician and diplomat, originally from Slovakia

July

- 2.7.1917 Czechoslovak Legionaries' victory at Zborov Battle
- 6.7.1415 Master John **Huss** burnt to death in Constance
- 11.7.1412 public execution of journeymans Jan, Stašek and Martin – first Hussite martyrs
- 13.7.1652 Virgin Mary Column in Prague consecrated by cardinal Arnošt Vojtěch of Harrach in presence of the emperor Ferdinand III
- 16.7. 622 Hijrah, Muhammad moved from Mecca to Medina – the dawning of Islam
- 18.7.1912 * Jindřich **Mánek**, Czech theologian
- 31.7.1627 counter-reformation mandate for Bohemia and Moravia issued as the part of the Restitution of the Land Order

August

- 3.8.1872 † Josef **Růžička**, Czech Protestant theologian
- 4.8.1427 Hussites' victory near Tachov over the crusade against "heretic Bohemia"
- 4.8.1992 † František cardinal **Tomášek**, professor and Czech theologian
- 6.8.1682 † Ján **Sinapius-Horčička**, Protestant parson, educationalist and writer, died in exile (banished)
- 18.8.1772 * Matúš **Blaho**, Slovak religious writer and Protestant parson
- 19.8.1662 † Blaise **Pascal**, French physicist and mathematician, who sympathized with Jansenism, also philosopher and theologian

- 22.8.1547 Bloody Congress in Prague, execution of 4 representatives of the First Estates Revolt against Ferdinand I the Hapsburg, reduction of privileges of Czech Estates
- 24.8.1572 St Bartholomew Day's Massacre, slaughtering of Huguenots in France, including their leader admiral Gaspard de Coligny
- 24.8.1822 * Benjamin **Košut**, Protestant parson
- 29.8.1602 restoration of the St Jacob Mandate against the Unity of Brethren by emperor Rudolph II

September

- 2.9.1567 * György **Thurzó**, familial Orava Governor, the Palatine of Hungary, convener of the Synod in Žilina in 1610, protector of the Protestants in Slovakia
- 4.9.1942 † **St Gorazd II**, Orthodox Church Bishop, executed due hiding of assassins of the Deputy/Acting Reich-Protector Reinhard Heydrich
- 9.9.1437 † Jan **Roháč of Dubá and Zion**, Hussite hetman and the last dissenter of the king Sigismund, executed
- 9.9.1972 † Prof Dr Josef Bohumil **Souček**, professor of the Comenius Protestant Faculty of Theology in Prague
- 10.9.1982 † Jan Blahoslav **Čapek**, comeniologist, writer and philosopher
- 14.9.1937 † Tomáš Garrigue **Masaryk**, president of Czechoslovakia, Czech statesman and philosopher
- 16.9.1732 peasants from Opočno region applied their lords for Brethren Protestant Confession permission
- 26.9.1212 emperor Frederick II issued the Gold Bull of Sicily

- 2.10.1972 † František Mrázek **Dobiáš**, professor of the Comenius Protestant Faculty of Theology in Prague
- 8.10.1772 † David **Nitschmann**, missionary and Unity of Brethren bishop
- 11.10.1424 † Jan **Žižka** of Trocnov, brilliant Hussite commander
- 18.10.1412 papal anathema for Master John Huss

- 22.10.1512 Dr Martin Luther appointed to be the professor of theology in Wittenberg
- 28.10.1767 * Adam **Chalupka**, preacher, educationalist and Church historian
- 31.10.1517 World Day of the Reformation (this day Dr Martin Luther nailed his 95 thesis on the church door at Wittenberg)

- 6.11.1832 founded Gustav-Adolf-Werk for supporting Protestant Churches in countries with majority of Roman Catholics
- 6.11.1872 * František **Bílek**, graphic designer, sculptor and architect
- 7.11.1992 † Alexander **Dubček**, Slovak politician, leading person of the Prague Spring 1968, died due the car accident
- 10.11.1827 † Michal **Blažek**, first Moravia Superintendent HC
- 13.11.1912 † Teréza **Nováková**, writer
- 16.11.1632 † **Gustav II Adolf**, Swedish king, protector of Protestants, killed in the Battle of Lützen
- 18.11.1877 * Otto **Škrovina**, preacher and senior, Church historian and journalist, signatory of the Martin Declaration in 1918
- 23.11.1972 † Veleslav **Růžička**, preacher, Church archivist of CHC
- 24.11.1572 † John **Knox**, Scottish reformer, founder of Presbyterianism

- 3.12.2017 † Luboš **Svoboda**, CHC parson, composer and singer in SEMAFOR
- 11.12.1617 church in Klostergrab demolished – the impulse for the third Defenestration of Prague and the cause of the Thirty Years' War
- 12.12.1952 † Prof Bedřich **Hrozný**, orientalist and founder of Hittitology
- 18.12.1882 * Samuel **Zoch**, bishops and Bratislava Governor, co-author and signatory of the Martin Declaration in 1918
- 31.12.1922 * ThB. Darina Bancíková, first Slovak protestant female parson and writer, persecuted during communism
